SYDNEY TO THE GREAT BARRIER REEF

14 days | Australia

In Sydney's Rocks District, revisit that historic moment when European settlers first came ashore 200 years ago. Up the scenic coast, learn about Australia's amazingly diverse marine biology. Feed dolphins on a sand island in Queensland, and see the Great Barrier Reef. This is nature's largest living organism, home to 400 kinds of coral and 1,500 species of fish.



Days 1-2: Fly to Australia

- Cross the International Date Line.

Day 3: Sydney

- Meet your Tour Director at the airport in Sydney, a stunning, cosmopolitan city of 4.6 million people that boasts world-class beaches, iconic architecture, and breathtaking natural wonders.
- Take a walking tour of The Rocks. Situated in the shadow of the Sydney Harbour Bridge, this well-preserved colonial neighbourhood marks the spot where Australia's first fleet of European settlers landed in 1788.

Day 4: Sydney

- Take a tour of Sydney.
- Enjoy a bird's-eye view of the city from the observation deck of Sydney Tower. At 1,063 feet, it's the second-tallest building south of the equator.
- See the skyline from a different angle on a boat tour of Sydney Harbour—and snap a picture of the world-famous Opera House.
- Explore the Hyde Park Barracks Museum, a UNESCO Heritage Site, on a unique tour that brings students face-to-face with Australia's convict heritage.
- Visit the National Opal Collection.

Day 5: Sydney

Full day to explore more of Sydney or
 visit Taronga Zoo and Sydney Opera House.

Day 6: Brisbane | Queensland sand island

- Fly to Brisbane.
- Welcome to Queensland! Australia's second largest state, Queensland is two and half times the size of Texas and is considered to be Australia's crown jewels. Queensland's natural wonders are world-renowned—the state boasts 200 national parks and five UNESCO World Heritage Sites, most notably the Great Barrier Reef. Queensland is also one of the only places on earth where two World Heritage Sites border one another.
- Take a ferry to one of the largest sand islands in the world. The creation of the island sand mass, its dynamic nature, and the ageing process of the dunes are superb examples of continuing geological and biological processes. During your stay you'll explore an incredible array of rich biodiversity. You are likely to spot hundreds of bird species, including the whitebellied sea eagle, as well as animals such as lizards, bandicoots, sugar gliders, turtles, dolphins, humpback whales, and dugongs.

Day 7: Queensland sand island

- Discover vast sand dunes, sunny beaches, subtropical rainforests, and rare perched lakes.
- Enjoy free time to explore, or
 enjoy a sand island safari.

Day 8: Rockhampton

- Take a ferry to the mainland.
- Travel to Rockhampton, Queensland's administrative and commercial center.
- Explore Rockhampton's sprawling streets and Victorian-era buildings.

Day 9: Airlie Beach

- Visit the Capricorn Caves.
- Travel to Airlie Beach.

Day 10: Airlie Beach

Full day to explore Airlie Beach or
take a Whitsunday Island cruise.

Day 11: Townsville | Cairns

- Travel via Townsville.
- Take a tour of Townsville.
- Continue on to Cairns.

Day 12: Cairns

Full day to explore more of Cairns or
visit Kuranda.

Day 13: Cairns | Great Barrier Reef

- Take an excursion to the Great Barrier Reef, one of the natural wonders of the world.
 Stretching 1,240 miles along the Queensland coast, the reef is nature's largest living organism. It is home to 400 kinds of coral, 1,500 species of fish, and 4,000 types of mollusk. Cruise from Cairns via speedy, airconditioned catamaran to the Great Barrier Reef and be amazed by the dazzling blue of the ocean around you. After mooring at the Reef, you can opt to swim, snorkel, or take a glass-bottomed boat ride to view the incredible scenery of this watery world: the electric colours of tropical fish, swaying plants, and exquisite corals.
- Time to explore more of the Great Barrier Reef orgo snorkeling with a marine biologist.

Day 14: Depart for home
